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#### 1. Description of the Initiative

Bookware software by Carleton Technologies Inc. (CTI) is to be implemented as a Library solution for complete inventory management, point of sale and e-commerce. It is the interface between students and Library. The objective of the Bookware project is to:

- Enable the Library to manage their inventory more efficiently.
- Increase productivity and profitability.
- Improve customer services and cost effectiveness.
- Improve processes and reporting.

It will be implemented as a cloud-based solution that supports both general merchandise and textbook items, including integrated support of new, used and digital copies of textbooks. Once an item is created it is available for use through out the system and tracked as it moves through the purchasing process. Detailed inventory reports can be printed for count discrepancies as well as sales analysis and profit reports. This solution will include;

- Bookware retail management application version 7
- Point of sale (POS) hardware
- Bank drivers for Moneris
- e-Solution version 4.

Phase 1 project scope will include;

- Back office
- Installation of Point-of-Sale (POS) hardware
- Website



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- Modules
- Data conversion
- Installation and training
- Campus eBookstore (code sales)

### 2. Scope of this PIA

The scope of this PIA covers the implementation of the Bookware cloud-based solution: the collection, use, disclosure, security and storage of customers, vendors and student personal information.

- a) To set up RRU Library staff on the system and training schedule first name, last names and emails of Library staff will be shared with the vendor.
- b) If sponsor cards will be used the student's unique identifier like student number may be shared with the vendor.
- c) During payment non-sensitive card holder Information such as name, masked card number, address verification. This is collected for fraud prevention, legal, and compliance requirements.
- d) Identity Information such as name, email and student or faculty number.
- e) Usage data: IP address, web browser and other data submitted automatically by the customer's web browser.

#### 5. Storage or Access outside Canada

Data will be stored within Canada in Ottawa and is only accessible only within Canada. All data is always stored in Canada. The main office has two stage, two factor authentications to access the server room.

The physical security of the facility is monitored 24hrs/day, 7days/week; additional CCTV security cameras monitor the interior of the facility 24hrs/day, 7days/week. The data center is temperature and humidity controlled.

The data center has 2N power redundancy, 2N redundant uninterruptured power supply (UPS) systems, high capacity continuous dual-fuel generators with fuel for a minimum of 24 hours of operation, and 24hrs/day, 7days/week power monitoring.

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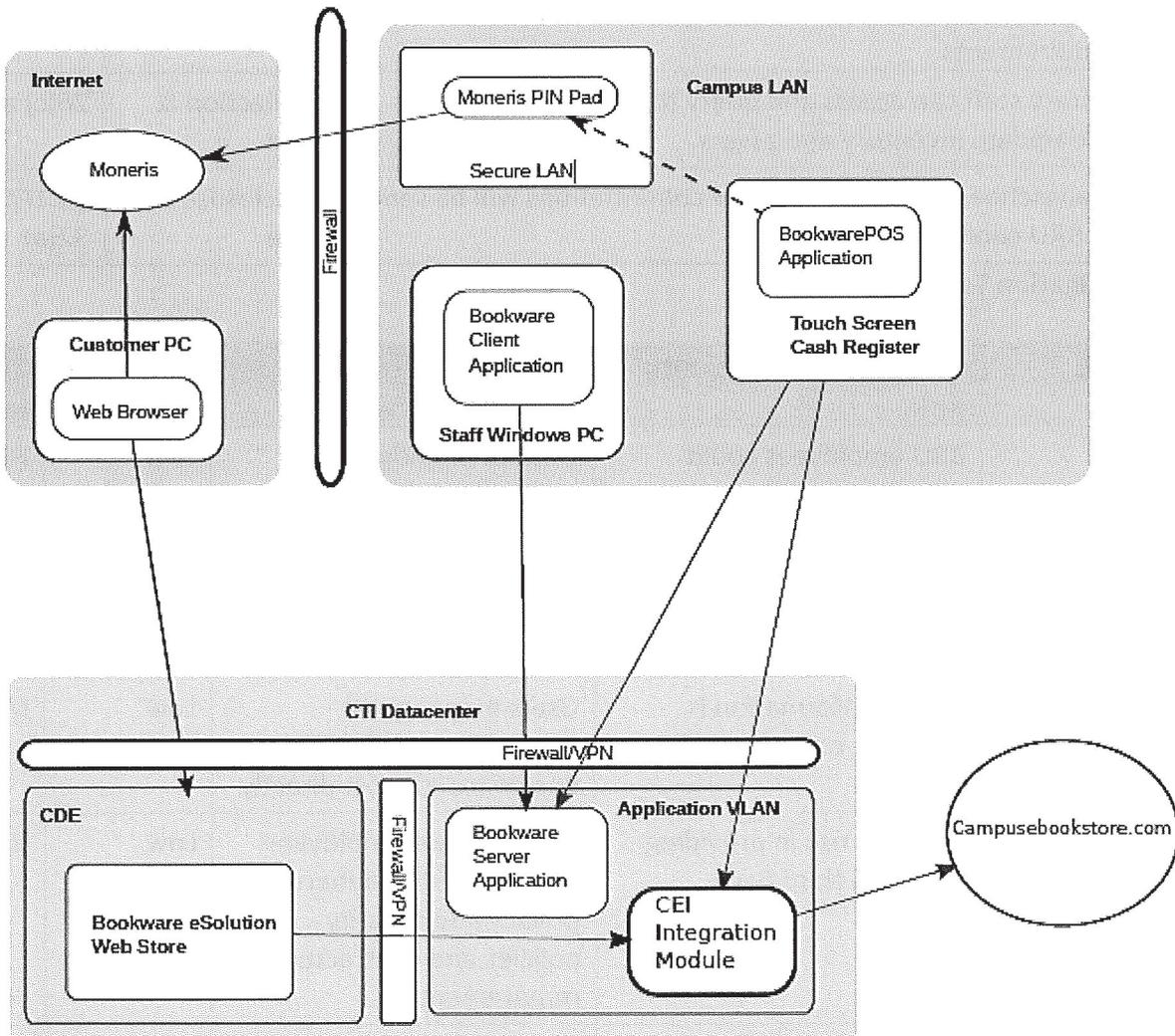
