Proctorio Learning Integrity Platform**

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1. Description of the Initiative

The Centre for Teaching & Educational Technologies (CTET) at Royal Roads University is piloting the Proctorio Learning Integrity Platform (Proctorio), an online proctoring service.

Proctorio is an online application and service that offers automated remote proctoring so students can take exams from anywhere. Each student's behavior is monitored by recording video, audio, and/or screen activity during the exam to try to ensure exam integrity. Students go through an authentication process before they start, so there is no need to set a specific date and time or pre-register. Students authenticate by logging into the RRU Moodle Learning Management System with their University provided computer access credentials. Moodle has a student photograph already available for each student so it is also easy to verify if the person taking the exam is indeed the actual student. Proctorio analyzes media in real-time and flags potential issues for instructor review, so instructors have the final decision.

Proctorio will integrate with RRU's learning management system, Moodle. It's seamless integration means there are no additional logins for students to remember and no scheduling issues to worry about as the student logs in using their existing RRU credentials. Because Proctorio fully integrates with all learning management systems and test platforms, test taker data stays with the testing institution and not with Proctorio. With Proctorio, RRU can easily add automated invigilation and identity verification in order to receive instantaneous integrity reports as soon as exams are submitted.

The Proctorio platform includes ID verification, automated invigilation, content protection, secure browser settings, computer lock down, originality authentication, administrative and faculty controls, and, analytics.

Proctorio uses advanced machine learning and state-of-the-art facial recognition technology to deliver accurate, reliable exam proctoring that outperforms human proctors.

Customizable settings allow instructors and administrators to create test environments specific to their assessment needs.

All data analytics and suspicious behaviors are captured during the assessment and integrity reports are immediately available for review upon exam submission.

A live proctoring option is available without scheduling which allows immediate intervention during an exam and provides full protection, recording, and reporting on demand.

To take a Proctorio proctored exam, students would:

1. Sign into the university Learning Management System (LMS) with their university computer account. This is how students access most of their course materials and interact with faculty and students. <https://moodle.royalroads.ca/moodle/login/index.php>
2. Initiate the exam activity from within a course. All exams are based on the Moodle quiz activity. https://docs.moodle.org/23/en/Quiz_module
3. Proctorio will then ensure the student's computer and internet connection meet the requirements to take the exam. A working camera and microphone must be available
4. Recording of audio, video and the computer screen are then started. These recordings are encrypted before being transmitted to and stored, with a second level of encryption, on Proctorio servers
5. Once the exam is completed, recording stops
6. The recordings can only be decrypted on the university LMS and viewed by authorized users

2. Scope of this PIA

This Privacy Impact Assessment will consider the collection, use, disclosure, security and storage of personal information for the Proctorio Learning Integrity Platform.

3. Related Privacy Impact Assessments

There are no other privacy impact assessments related to this PIA.

4. Elements of Personal Information or Data

When taking an exam, personal information collected by RRU includes the Moodle user id#, exam id#, IP address of the computer being used to take the exam and student behaviours during the exam (collected via video, audio and/or screen activity). This information is encrypted before transfer and before it is stored and Proctorio has no access or ability to decrypt the data while being stored on their servers.

The only time Proctorio would contact a student would be in the case that the student had any technical difficulties and needed assistance with troubleshooting. In this instance the student would reach out to Proctorio for assistance at that time. Proctorio will not invite users to participate in surveys, questionnaires, contests or to provide feedback.

If a student contacts Proctorio support outside of the LMS/Moodle the student's name, phone number, institution name, and campus email address may be collected to facilitate the troubleshooting process. Disclosure of such information is considered voluntary and will not be used to create a record.

The personal contact information gathered is not verified as Proctorio does not have any previously collected personal information to compare it to.

Part 2 – Protection of Personal Information

5. Storage or Access outside Canada

All student information collected during an exam is stored in an encrypted state outside of Canada on Microsoft Azure's cloud environment and is available only to the RRU course instructor, select RRU program support staff and some RRU Moodle (LMS) administrators. Proctorio has no ability to access the encrypted personal information.

6. Data-linking Initiative*

Your personal information is collected under the authority of the *University Act* and is subject to the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*. Your personal information will be used to initiate Proctorio's exam proctoring services including the recording of video and audio of you while you take your exam(s). The personal information will be reviewed by your instructor to ensure that all examination requirements are being met, and will be used if you request technological support services from Proctorio as required. Your personal information will be encrypted and confidentially stored by Proctorio outside of Canada at a Microsoft Azure cloud storage facility in the US. Proctorio will not have any capability to decrypt your personal information at any time while it is being stored. Your personal information will not be disclosed to any other external third parties unless we are directed to do so by you. The LMS will restrict who can access or delete collected data based on need to know principles. It is not possible to add data other than by taking an exam. There is no way to change recorded data.

Yes, exams are proctored online to confirm student's conformity to the testing requirements.

RRU:

Courses are kept for three years after they have completed as per University course archive guidelines.

Proctorio:

Proctorio will store and maintain institutional data for up to 30 days after the termination of an applicable agreement, unless otherwise specified. If RRU has entered into a SaaS Agreement with Proctorio then they will retain the data for six months by active data retention and for one year by cold storage. According to the Institution's preference regarding data destruction, Proctorio will either: 1) destroy the data, or 2) deliver it to the Institution.

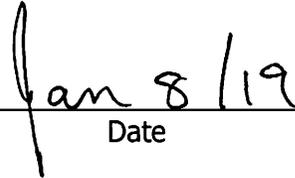
