



# Privacy Impact Assessment for Non-Ministry Public Bodies

## *Arca - Institutional Repository*

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### **Part 1 - General**

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#### **1. Description of the Initiative**

Through the JIBC Library, Faculty, Students and Staff will have anytime, anywhere access to research created by BC post-secondary institutions. This is thanks to a new partnership between the British Columbia Electronic Library Network (BC ELN) and Charlottetown, PEI-based software firm 'Discoverygarden', supported by a grant from the Ministry of Advanced Education and the Administrative Services Delivery Transformation (ASDT) Steering Committee.

The BC Shared Digital Resources and Institutional Repository Network (the BC IR Network) will be built on Islandora, a Canadian-developed open-source platform currently in use at over 100 public and private institutions worldwide. This shared platform/software will provide post-secondary institutions with open-access repositories for research, theses, and any other digital assets they wish to make available to the wider community.

To arrive at this milestone, the BC IR Network Software Selection Committee (SSC), comprised of representatives from eight BC post-secondary libraries (BCIT, College of the Rockies, Douglas College, ECUAD, JIBC, SFU, TRU and UFV), evaluated four shortlisted respondents. Islandora, supported and hosted in Canada by 'Discoverygarden', emerged as the clear choice for the project. The decision was unanimously endorsed by the BC IR Network Advisory Committee [April Haddad from the JIBC being a member of this committee] and the BC ELN Steering Committee. The name chosen for this repository is Arca.



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'Discoverygarden' has been contracted to support the implementation and to manage Canadian hosting. This partnership allows the BC IR Network to take advantage of a robust open-source platform, without the internal technical resources normally required by open-source adopters.

Participating libraries will share a single repository, with individual customized website interfaces providing portals to their own content. The repository will house a broad variety of institutional knowledge, including scholarly material and digital assets such as administrative documents, newsletters, images, multimedia and audiovisual materials. These materials are normally available to the public via other means and contain no information deemed personal or confidential. The invoice to cover JIBC's portion of the BC IR Network Support Fee is attached (Appendix A).

"The BC IR Network will create an environment where institutions of all sizes can contribute to provincial knowledge sharing," says Gilbert Bede of Okanagan College, Chair of the Software Selection Committee. "Working together through BC ELN will ensure the best use of resources, including sharing of expertise, best practices and limited funds, while making the results of publicly funded research at our many institutions available to all British Columbians."

The part of the initiative that this PIA covers is specifically to determine FOIPPA risk and compliance in joining this collaboration.

## **3. Related Privacy Impact Assessments**

No other PIAs have been conducted at the JIBC with respect to this initiative, however, please find attached (Appendix B, pages 22-24) the Privacy Protection Schedule agreed upon between BC ELN/SFU and 'Discoverygarden'.



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#### 4. Elements of Information or Data

The elements of information or data involved in the initiative are documents, images, streaming media and audio. The Library's eResources Librarian will administer (through an Administration portal, secured by password) the credentials that allow faculty, staff and students to gain access specifically to JIBC's repository in order to upload content. While the repository is part of a consortium, where the holdings of all colleges and universities will be accessible by members all institutions and the general public, only faculty, staff and students associated with JIBC and who receive the proper JIBC credentials will be allowed to upload information or data. The eResources Librarian will ensure that all credentials are kept up-to-date and in synchronization with changes to faculty, staff and students.

Once the content is uploaded, it will be vetted by designated Library staff, to ensure compliance with JIBC repository collection guidelines. The uploaded material will also be vetted to ensure that all necessary copyright documents are signed and provide JIBC Library with the authority to release these documents into the active folders. The information and data that is under control of the Library originates strictly from JIBC faculty, staff or students.

##### **About Islandora**

[Islandora](#) is an open-source software framework designed to help institutions and organizations and their audiences collaboratively manage and discover digital assets using a best-practices framework. Islandora was originally developed by the University of Prince Edward Island's Robertson Library, but is now implemented and contributed to by an ever-growing international community.

##### **About Discoverygarden**

'*Discoverygarden*' helps all manner of organizations manage and preserve important digital assets with the Open Source Islandora framework. As the primary contributor to the Islandora project, they have developed unparalleled expertise. 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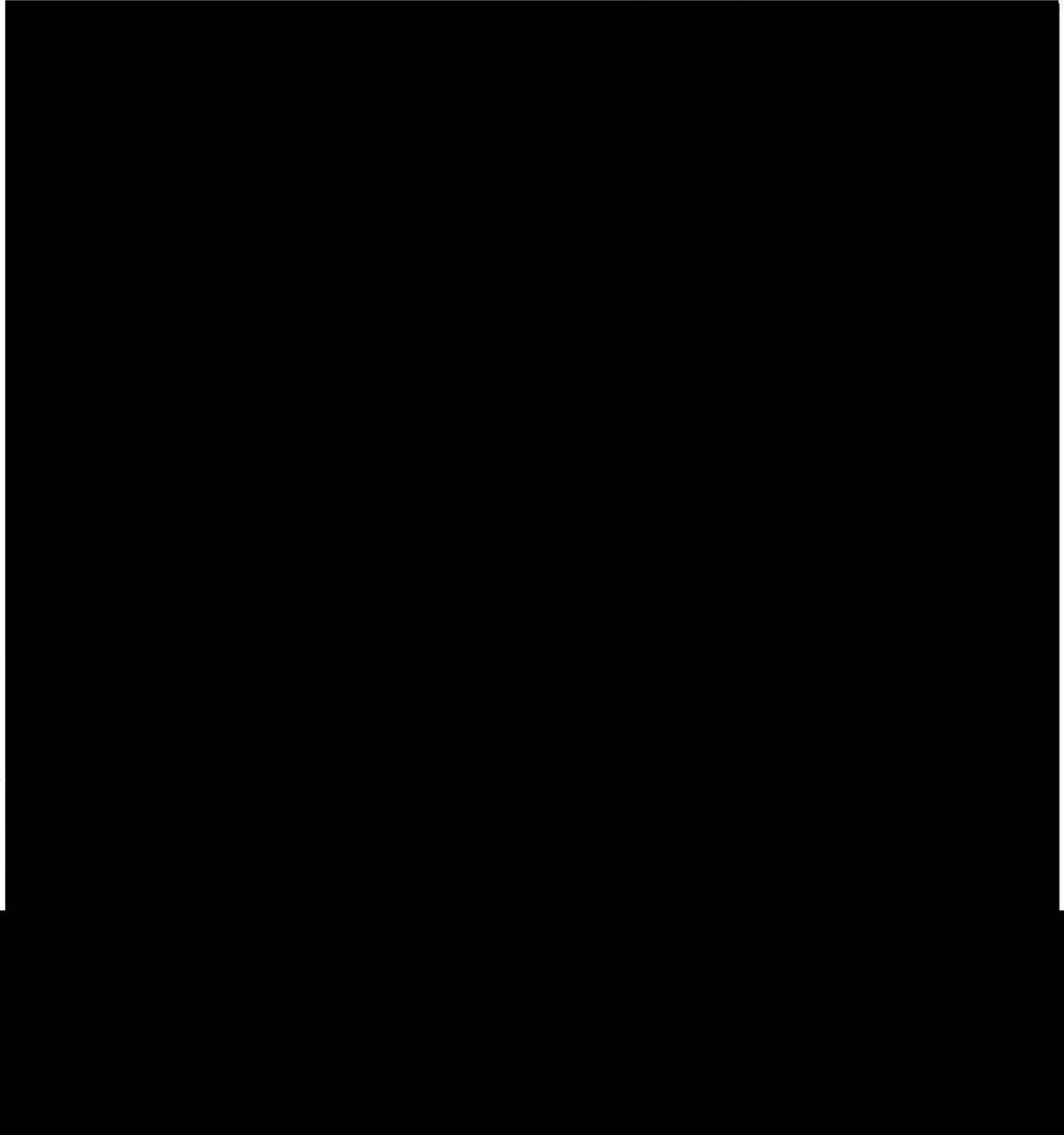

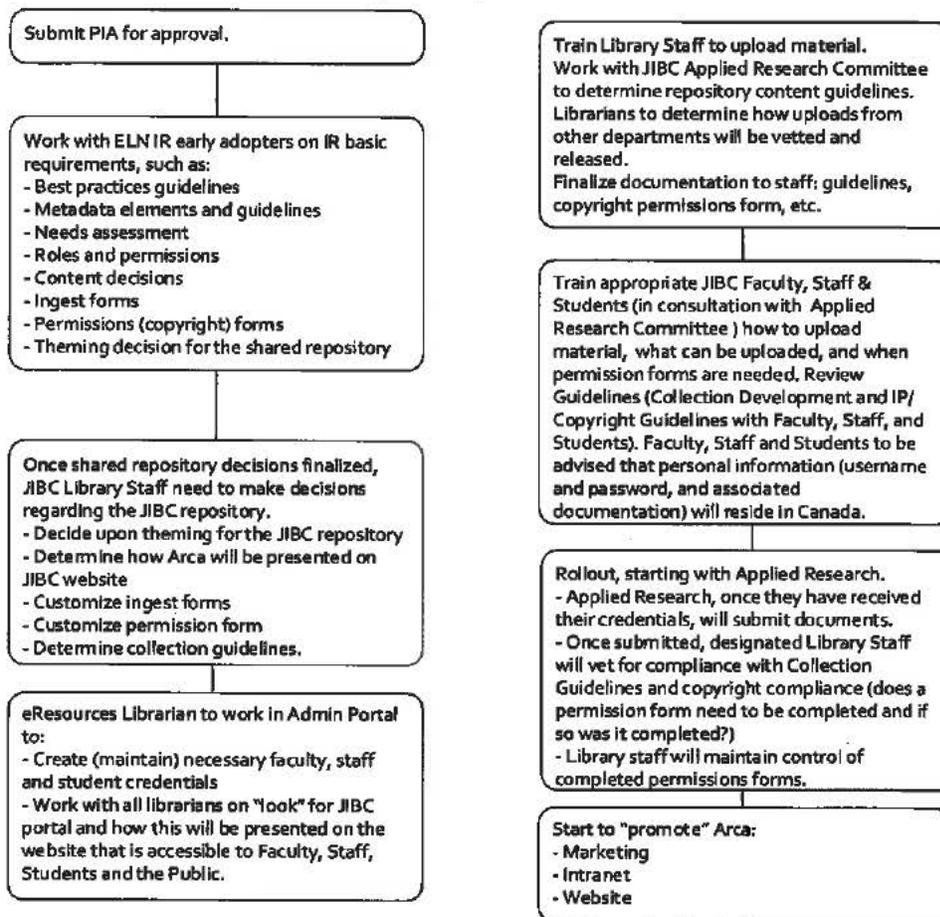

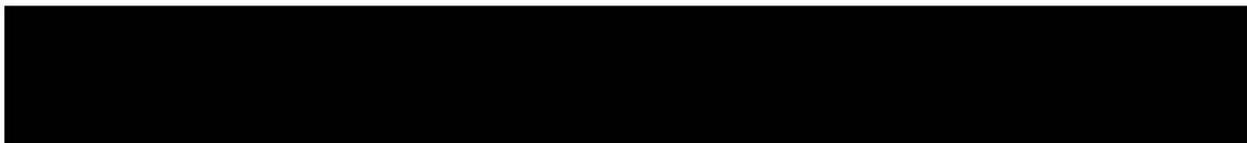
The JIBC Library will not collect information about the user. Statistics are gathered to record the number of users accessing the material.

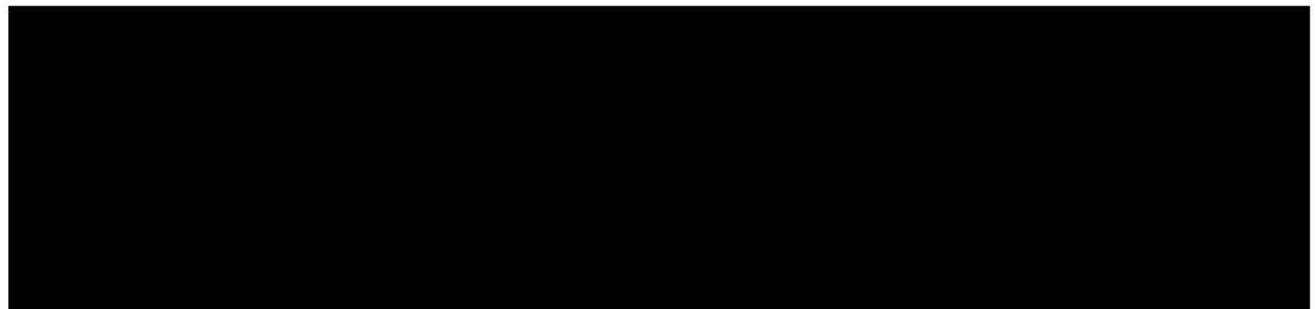
