For the last 5 years, the UNBC Childcare Center is experiencing significant demand, evident by the existence of a large waitlist for childcare spaces, currently 117 children in the 3 years-old age range. Recognizing the pressing need to accommodate more families, UNBC is exploring the possibility of expanding its childcare facilities as part of UNBC's Five Year Capital Plan for 2024-2028.

There is potential provincial funding available to support this expansion project, which could enable the construction of a new facility. To proceed with the application process, UNBC aims to gather essential information from within the UNBC community to demonstrate the urgency and necessity for additional childcare spaces.

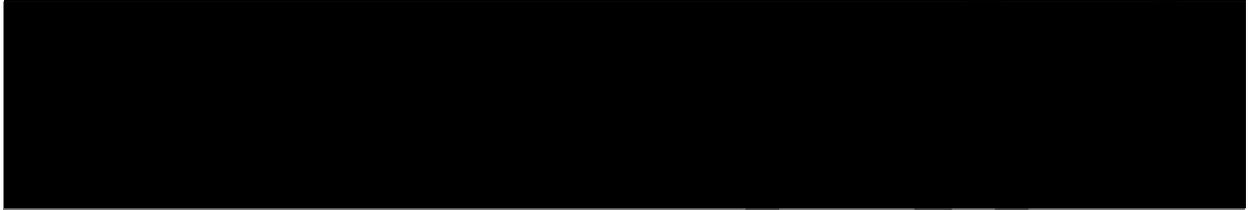

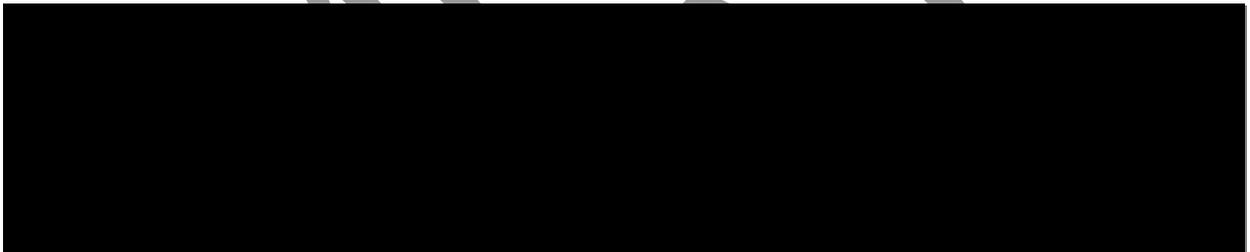

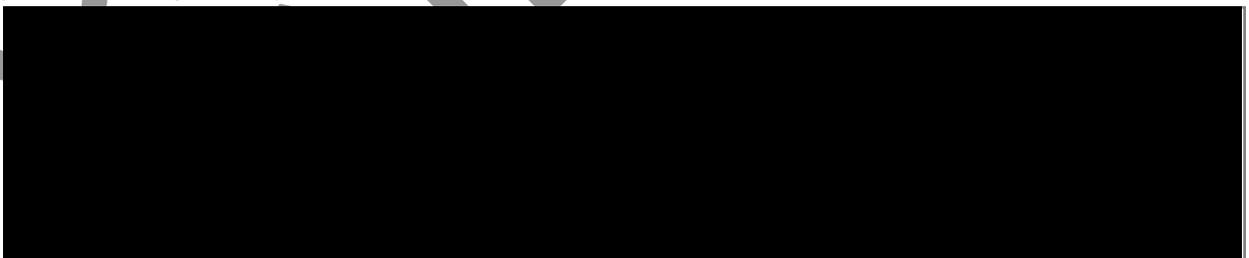
