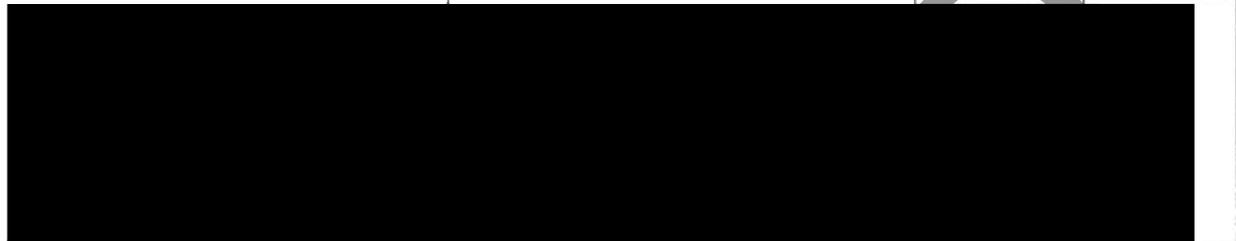

N/A -- > Students will be provided with the opportunity to alias themselves during the registration process with McGraw-Hill Connect. A splash screen will remind students that their data is being transmitted to a server that is outside of Canada and will explain how the security features will protect them. An example is below:

The University of Northern British Columbia recommends that you use an alias when registering with McGraw Hill Connect to prevent your performance data within this service from being directly associated with you while being transmitted to Virginia in the United States of America. Using an alias will not impact your ability to receive grades because McGraw Hill Connect does not directly send grading information to your Blackboard account. An identifier key masks your personal information when data is transferred between UNBC and McGraw-Hill Connect.

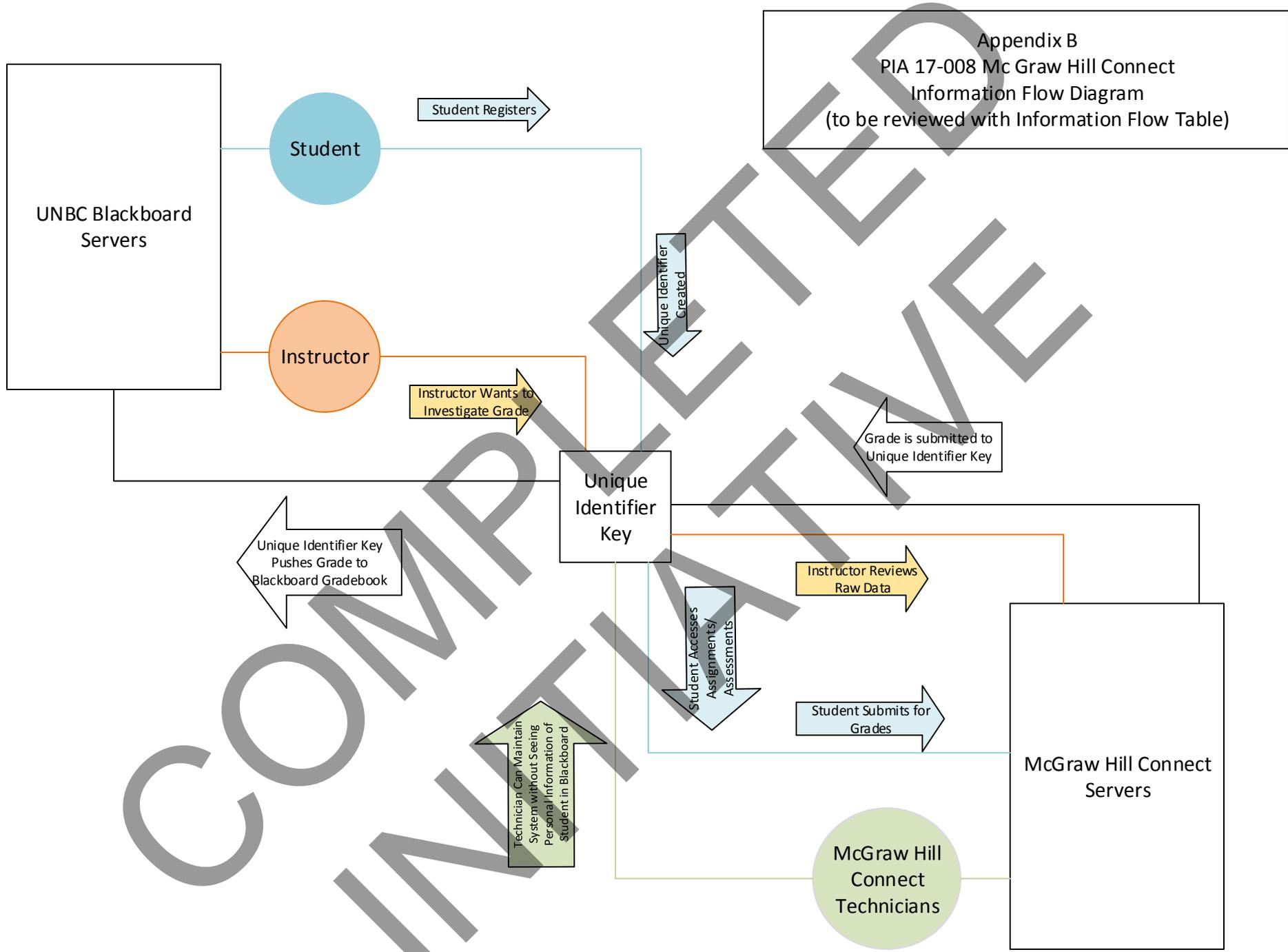
