Springshare controls the retention of user's information and the library will work with Springshare to ensure that data over three years old is disposed of annually. The library will retain requests for three years in order to comply with copyright regulations, analyze the short term history of a user's requests, and analyze the frequency of types of requests in order to improve customer service.

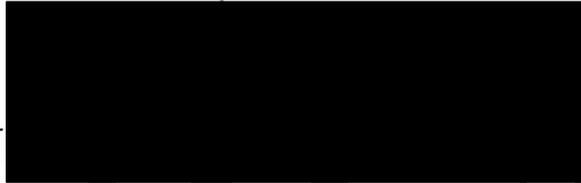
