

Why do I need to do a PIA (Privacy Impact Assessment)?

Section 69(5.3) of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (FIPPA) requires the head of a public body to conduct a privacy impact assessment (PIA) in accordance with the directions of the minister responsible for FIPPA. Public bodies should contact the Information Governance Officer to determine internal policies for review and sign-off of the PIA. What if my initiative does not include personal information?

1. Description of the Initiative

Sync.com provides cloud based file storage for personal computing devices that individuals affiliated with UNBC can use to conduct collaborative work, as an alternative to cloud services which do not meet the residency requirements within the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (like DropBox). Files that are stored in a designated folder on a computer are automatically replicated into Sync.com's cloud infrastructure. Files can also be accessed from, and stored by, mobile devices, and web browsers. Files stored on Sync.com can be shared with other users of Sync.com; file shares can be set up dynamically to include specific individuals with whom the files are desired to be shared. Sync.com is a Canadian company with data centres only in Canada (specifically Toronto and Markham, Ontario). No data other than the files themselves are stored in Sync.com (for example, there is no Active Directory synchronization).

2. Scope of this PIA

This PIA covers the sharing of documents with external parties. While email is currently used to share small files, the current process for sharing large files with parties external to UNBC is to use

an internally developed, but outdated, system (fileportal.unbc.ca). The internal system was developed for the purpose of sharing large files so as to avoid encumbering UNBC's email system with large attachments. Whatever documents are currently being shared, and whatever policies are currently in place would also apply to using sync.com. This is NOT intended to be used as a wholesale document storage system; UNBC has its own internal document storage system (also known by common terms such as "H: Drive" or "G: Drive" among other names).

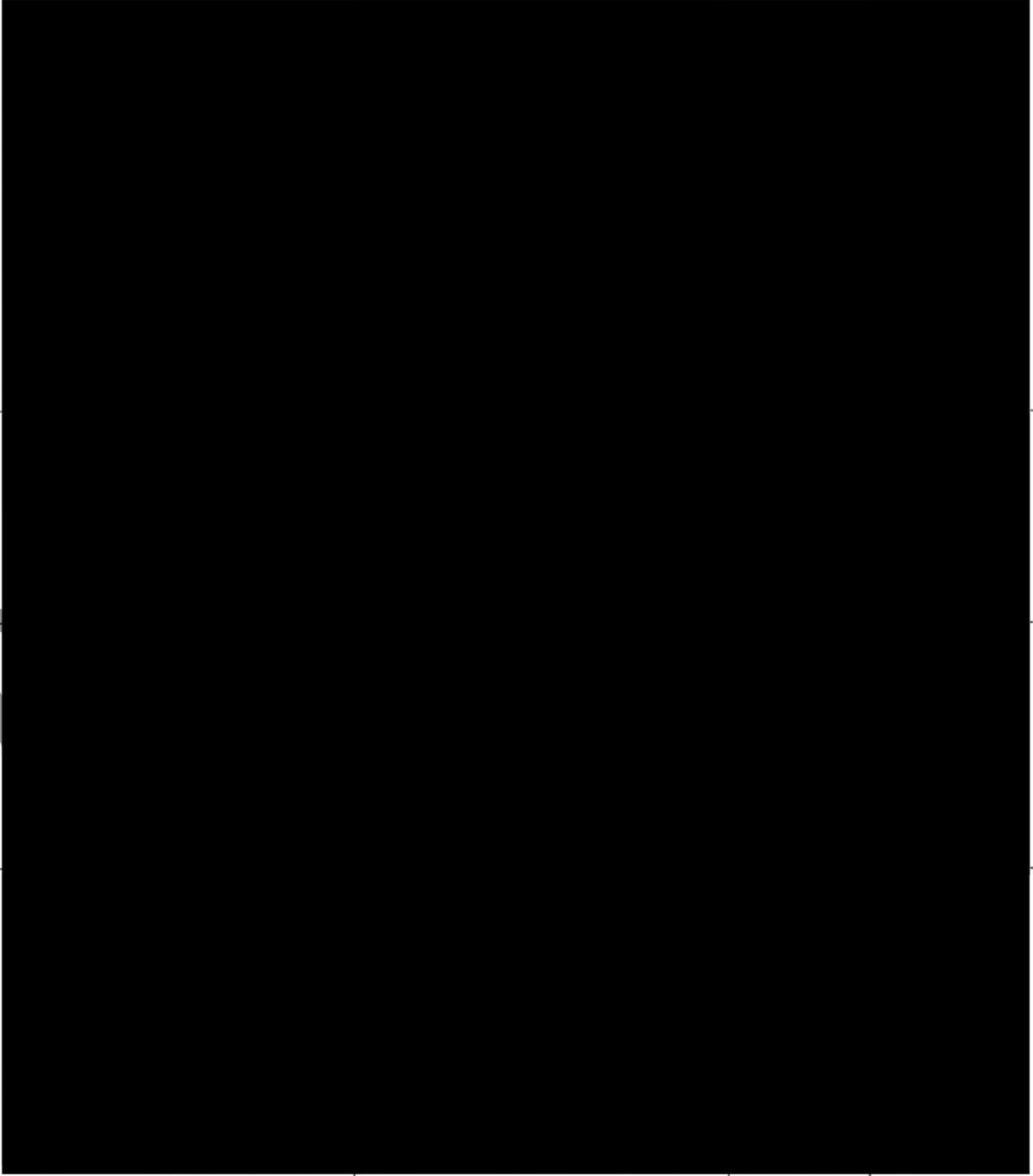
