*evisions Argos delivers flexible, powerful, easy-to-use reporting tools designed by higher education experts to help post secondary institutions the insights to make timely, better-informed decisions based on student, departmental and institutional data in real time. Interactive reports and dashboards illustrate that data, providing insights at a glance and improving visibility throughout the institution.*

*This initiative is part of a re-implementation of the base-line evisions Argos product without the custom coding from Oracle that UNBC was using to manage the system. By making this product base-line evisions can provide ongoing customer support by completing upgrades, patching and repairs on our behalf.*

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## 2. Scope of this PIA

*This PIA will address the privacy risks and recommended practices regarding evisions direct access to UNBC systems and data in the custody of control of UNBC by evsions technicians to upgrade and conduct future maintenance of Argos. Argos is an in-house reporting software linking to Ellucian Banner to provide transcript and other student reports. This PIA doesn't address all use of Argos, but focuses specifically on the transcript solution.*

*A PIA was conducted on evisions in 2012 but the PIA in the records is incomplete and will not reflect practices moving forward.*

### 5. Storage or Access outside Canada

*Storage of all transcript data is managed on UNBC systems. evisions will access UNBC data stores directly from a remote access point by using UNBC's virtual desktop interface (VDI). evisions technical staff will be conducting their work on our systems from Irvine, California. The use of the VDI will allow UNBC data to remain on UNBC systems, limiting disclosure outside of Canada to only temporary screen image data. Temporary access of this nature, will be designed to be compliant with 33.1(1)(p) of the Act by providing direct, minimal and scheduled access to UNBC information using UNBC resources.*

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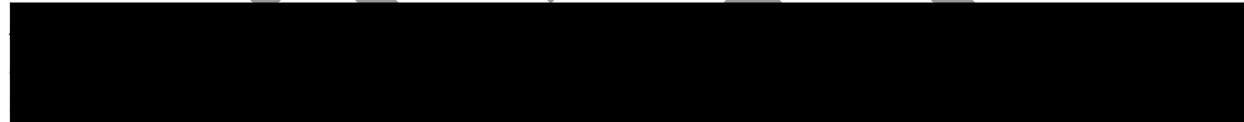
