1. Description of the Initiative

NOTE: The use of Bulb is by consent only and students who do not want to use Bulb are provided an alternative means to developing an eportfolio via a PowerPoint template developed within the department and using of Microsoft Office PowerPoint. This alternative is made clear during the process of obtaining informed voluntary consent.

Bulb (<https://my.bulbapp.com/>) has been in use in the Faculty of Education for several years now. The creation of a teacher education eportfolio is a graduation requirement for B.Ed. candidates in the Faculty of Education at Vancouver Island University (VIU). This eportfolio is created in a developmental manner—often over 2 or more years in the program until it is presented prior to graduation. Creating a web accessible eportfolio provides significant educational advantages for teachers and learners for continuous collaboration and feedback, within and across classes, while students demonstrate their attainment of the 9 professional standards required for credentialing in British Columbia.

Bulb provides a proven platform for the creation of eportfolios as well as key mechanisms for development and sharing of eportfolio materials, within and across courses, and among instructors and students. As this is an eportfolio tool, it is expected students will contribute some personally identifiable information with, and through, Bulb: this will include user account information, profile information, and other pages, collections, or content created, embedded, or linked by the student.

Students can establish privacy settings for all content uploaded including images, audio, video, document, and links. However, no online software can guarantee that personal identifiable data will be 100% secure; there will always be an element of risk when placing personal information online and outside of Canada where the data is subject to the laws of the United States, including US governmental access without notice. Additional privacy challenges arise if students choose to access their Bulb accounts from a country other than Canada or the US (eg. an international student accessing Bulb at home in India during a visit or a student on vacation in Mexico). **BulbApp privacy policy available: <https://my.bulbapp.com/privacy-policy/>**

Data collected by Bulb or uploaded by users will include personal identifiable information as understood under British Columbia’s Freedom of Information & Protection of Privacy Act (BC FIPPA). This data will be stored external to Canada on Amazon Web servers in the United States.

Bulb does not sell or rent user data. If a service provider needs to access information about users to perform services on Bulb’s behalf, they do so under instruction from Bulb, including abiding by policies and procedures consistent with Bulb policies designed to protect user information.

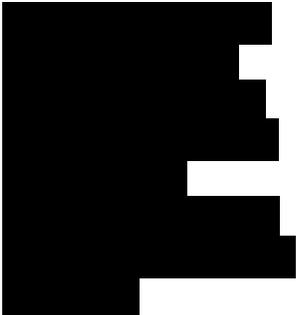

2.	DATA RETENTION	<p>Bulb retains personal information for as long as needed to provide services to subscribed users to comply with Bulb’s legal obligations, resolve disputes, and enforce agreements. User data will be retained as long as the student is subscribed as a user via their VIU Faculty of Education account for service provision. To comply with US privacy law under Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) standards, Bulb may be required to keep user data if a FERPA request is pending. When that data is no longer legitimately needed, Bulb will either delete or anonymize it; where this is not possible “(for example, because your personal information has been stored in backup archives)” Bulb will securely store the personal information and “isolate it from any further processing until deletion is possible”.</p> <p>It should also be noted that if students publish or share user content with others, others may</p>
