



PIA01534 — Oncehub Appointment System

PART 1: GENERAL INFORMATION & OVERVIEW

1.1 Executive Summary

The UBC Sauder School of Business MBA division uses Oncehub, an appointment scheduling system, to assist with booking advising appointments within the unit. Users are able to select appointment times and conveniently schedule discussion time slots with advisors.

This service has been in use since 2019 and will be phased out in 2022 as part of the implementation of a new CRM system based on the Salesforce platform, subject to a separate PIA. A new PIA will like likewise be required for the forthcoming replacement service.

1.2 Project Description

We require a system that allows students to conveniently sign up for appointment times on a system, and that allows a team of 4-6 Recruitment & Admissions Managers to manually and independently provide appointment times, and in varying time zones (as we do overseas appointments too). We would also require a system such as 10to8 that provides students with automatic and customizable reminders via text and email. The system we are looking at is known as 10to8: <http://10to8.com> PIA Advisor Note: The project has proceeded with Oncehub instead of 10to8 as outlined in the original project description above.

RISK CLASSIFICATION

The inherent privacy risk classification level of this PIA submission is 4 – **High**.
The residual risk classification level of this PIA submission at closure is 3 – **Medium**.

1.3 Scope

The scope of this assessment covers the implementation of an appointment scheduling tool by the business school staff who are authorized to use the product on behalf of UBC, as outlined in this PIA.

1.4 Data Elements

For advising appointments, the system collects essential contact information and academic program details.

For recruitments and admissions appointments, personal information collected includes first name, last name, email, mobile telephone number, location (country), program of interest, and resume/CV.

Oncehub also collects personal information via tracking cookies embedded within user's web browsers (e.g. Google Analytics) Users may opt out of using cookies at the start of a browsing session.

1.5 Storage or Access Outside of Canada (including back-ups and recovery)

Includes storage outside of Canada using internationally recognized cloud services providers.

1.6 Data-Linking Initiative

This project is not considered a data linking initiative as contemplated under FIPPA s. (36).

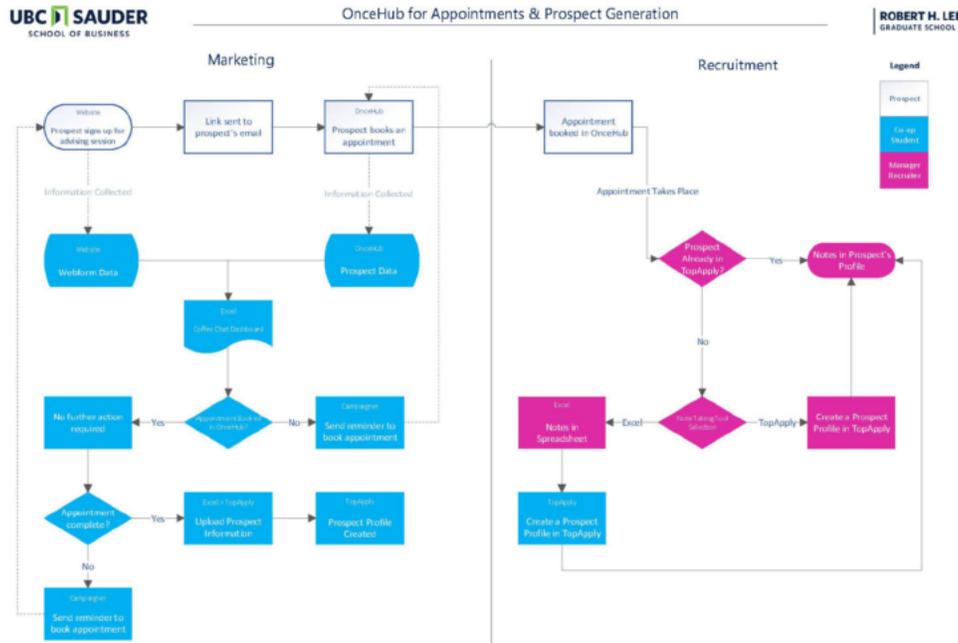

2.3 Collection Notice

The standard UBC consent notice has been applied on the Sauder web page where personal information is collected.

2.4 Consent for Storage/Access Outside of Canada & Opt-Out Procedure (If Any)

Users will be required to consent to having their personal information collected and stored outside of Canada. Users who elect to withhold consent for storage of their information outside of Canada are provided a different choice, typically an email option.

2.5 Consent Withheld Procedure

Users may reach out to the Sauder MBA program directly to schedule an appointment and are not required to use the Oncehub service. The PI will be collected from users when they complete the booking. The service is not required to book an appointment, however, as users will be told that they can contact the MBA Office directly for an appointment booking if they do not wish to use Oncehub. There will be a privacy and consent notification on the appointment booking page that users can see before booking an appointment.

PART 3: SECURITY OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

3.1 Physical Security Measures

This project is required to comply with UBC Policy SC14 (Information Systems Policy) and applicable UBC ISS (Information Security Standards).

3.2 Technical Security Measures

UBC requires data centres to comply with a detailed set of security requirements. Oncehub servers are hosted at AWS US. UBC has relied on publicly available documentation and vendor supplied documentation to establish a level of comfort over the physical security of AWS data centres. The physical security capabilities of AWS data centres meet the UBC standard.

3.4 Tracking Access/Access Controls

Sauder MBA staff as well as Oncehub technical support teams will have access to personal information contained within the platform.

4.1 Updating and Correcting Personal Information

4.2 Decisions That Directly Affect an Individual

This project does not capture personal information that directly affects an individual.

4.3 Records Retention and Disposal

This project is required to comply with UBC Records Management Policies.

A data retention and destruction plan has not been made available and it is recommended that the project consult with the UBC Records Management Office for the records retention and destruction guidelines. This observation is included in the risk mitigation table.

This project does not involve the systemic disclosure of personal information.

5.2 Access for Research or Statistical Purposes

This project is not subject to other applicable legislation or regulations.

PART 6: ACCESS AND PRIVACY MANAGER COMMENTS

6.1 Information or Materials Reviewed

The following documents have been reviewed in the context of this PIA. The provided information was deemed reasonable to provide an understanding of operating privacy and security controls.

6.2 Analysis and Findings

The information provided for the review has established that Oncehub and the associated use-case, as presented by the UBC Sauder School of Business, can be used in the proposed manner in compliance with FIPPA and UBC policies and standards.

The following are the key factors in that determination:

- Personal information is collected, stored, and accessed within Canada, and outside of Canada with appropriate consent;
- Personal information is not disclosed to third parties external to authorized UBC staff members;
- Access to the service requires use of a valid login credentials with appropriate access authorities;
- Information is kept secure during transmission and at rest.

Privacy and security risks were noted during our review. Specifically, concerns were raised about the overcollection and retention of personal information within the Oncehub service, and the need to address these risks. The project has been made aware of the recommended remediation actions as outlined in the risk mitigation plan to minimize risk exposures and to comply with FIPPA and UBC Information Security Standards. Accordingly, Oncehub can continue be used as proposed subject to the conditions outlines in the following section.

6.3 Conditions of Approval

- Implementation of the recommended risk mediations to limit overcollection and data retention risks.
- A new PIA will be required for the replacement service as well as any further integrations with other UBC tools/services.
- Any email plugin use that requires advisors to share their login credentials is not authorized.

6.4 Review and Distribution

The Minister of Citizens’ Services Direction 2-21, [Privacy Impact Assessment Directions](#) requires that all PIAs “designate the appropriate level of position that holds accountability for a PIA, proportionate to the sensitivity of the personal information and/or the risks of the initiative” (s. D8).

Accountability is maintained by the role or position, regardless of who fills the role.

Under [UBC Policy SC14](#), Administrative Heads of Unit are responsible for:

- ensuring that UBC Electronic Information and Systems are secured with adequate controls, with particular care concerning User identification and validation measures;
- ensuring, as appropriate or required, that UBC Electronic Information within their area of responsibility is maintained, transmitted, and stored in a secure and consistent manner that adheres to all relevant University policies and standards;
- authorizing access for individuals to UBC Electronic Information and Systems within their area of responsibility;
- renewing, retiring, and revoking User authorizations within their area of responsibility.

Holding accountability for the privacy risks of this initiative includes:

- reviewing the mitigation strategies listed in the relevant risk tables and ensuring those strategies are maintained throughout the life of the initiative;
- ensuring accountability is transferred to any individual who assumes this role;
- if there are any changes to the initiative, including to the way personal information is collected, used, stored or disclosed, ensuring the PIA team is engaged, and if necessary, completing a PIA update; and
- understanding what your privacy obligations are, and if not, following up with the PIA team.
